The Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University recruits international students who wish to enroll in the four-year doctoral course of the HIGO Program. The English language is used for all classes and research instructions in this program.

Qualifications of Applicants

1) Educational Background:

All applicants should have completed 18 years of education period and research experience if any by the entrance date of Kumamoto University. Thus applicants must satisfy at least one of the following six education backgrounds and research experience if any.

- ① Applicants must be graduates of a six-year medical, dental, pharmaceutical or veterinary school outside of Japan, or be expected to graduate from such a school by March 2013 to be eligible to enroll in April 2013, or by September 2013 to be eligible to enroll in October 2013.
- ② Applicants must be graduates of a five-year medical, dental, pharmaceutical or veterinary school outside of Japan, and must have conducted research for at least one year in a university or a research institute outside of Japan after completion of formal education, or be expected to finish such a process by March 2013 to be eligible to enroll in April 2013, or by September 2013 to be eligible to enroll in October 2013.
- ③ Applicants must be graduates of a four-year medical, dental, pharmaceutical or veterinary school outside of Japan, and must have conducted research for at least two years in a university or a research institute outside of Japan after completion of formal education, or be expected to finish such a process by March 2013 to be eligible to enroll in April 2013, or by September 2013 to be eligible to enroll in October 2013.
- ④ Applicants must hold a Master's degree from an institution which has two-year education programs outside of Japan, after completion of 16 years of formal education outside of Japan, or be expected to meet this requirement by March 2013 to be eligible to enroll in April 2013, or by September 2013 to be eligible to enroll in October 2013.
- (5) Applicants must have conducted research for at least two years in a university or a research institute, after completion of 16 years of formal education outside of Japan, and be recognized as having an education that is equivalent to a Master's degree.
- 6 Applicants must be recognized by the Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University as having attainments equal to or greater than a Master's degree.
- 2) Health:

Applicants must be in a good physical and mental health.

3) Language:

Applicants must have earned the minimum required score in any one of the following: ①TOEFL-iBT ②TOEFL-CBT ③TOEFL-PBT ④TOEIC ⑤IELTS

4) Visa:

Applicants must have a student visa when coming to Japan

Period of Study

Four (4) years from April 2013 to March 2017 or from October 2013 to September 2017

Scholarship Benefits

Successful applicants are eligible to receive a stipend while in school (200,000 JPY per month for the 2013 academic year).

Note that the amount of scholarship is subject to change each academic year.

Also note that the qualifications for this privilege may be reassessed during mid-term evaluations.

Screening Procedure

- Applicants must choose one of the research leaders in the Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University as his/her prospective supervisor, and must obtain permission to apply for this program from the supervisor beforehand.
- Applicants must obtain all application information and forms through Internet by themselves. After filling in all the forms, they must send them to their prospective supervisor of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences.
- 3) Their prospective supervisors must submit all application forms to the committee for this program before the deadline for application.
- 4) The committee will have examinations for those who apply to the program. The main parts of the examination are the English test (TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS), essay and interviews.
- 5) Interviews by three committee members will be held over Internet. For details of the internet-based interview, please refer to "Instruction for internet-based interview of Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University" The essay exam will also be held over Internet. As an alternative, if the foreign applicants are visiting Japan on the day of the entrance examination (March 13, 2013) for Japanese applicants, they will be able to take the essay exam and have interviews with three committee members in Kumamoto University.
- 6) The total of scores of the English test, essay and interviews with three committee members will be used to score the examination.

Date of Enrollment

April 1, 2013 or October 1, 2013

(Those who wish to enroll on April 1 must complete the admission procedures by March 27 following the examination results to be announced on March 22.)

Degrees

After successful fulfillment of the four-year course of the HIGO Program, a Doctor of Philosophy degree will be conferred.

Application Deadline

The research leaders, or prospective supervisors, of the international students should collect and submit all documents required for application to the Student Affairs Section, School of Medicine.

The deadline is Tuesday, March 5, 2013.

- 6) Written Statement of Reasons for Application (Form 3)
- 7) Examination fee (30,000 JPY)
- 8) <u>A copy of the applicant's English examination score (Either of the following: TOEFLibt</u> (Score should be 50 or higher), TOEFLcbt (143 or higher), TOEFLpbt (463 or higher), IELTS (4.5 or higher) or TOEIC (480 or higher)
- 9) A letter from the applicant's employer indicating agreement with this application, if the applicant is an employee.

Additional Statements:

- 1) Applicants are urged to discuss a research plan with their prospective supervisors of the Graduate School of Medical Sciences, Kumamoto University beforehand.
- 2) All documents should be typewritten on A4 size paper.
- 3) Applications with incomplete information, or those submitted after the deadline, will not be accepted.
- 4) No application materials will be returned to the applicants.
