The Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University recruits international students who wish to enroll in the Master Course of the HIGO Program Basic Course. The English language is used for all classes and research instructions in this program.

Qualifications of Applicants

- 1) Applicants should be persons without Japanese nationality who meet any of the following educational background from ① to ④.
 - ① Applicants who have completed, or are due to complete in March 2014 to be eligible to enroll in April 2014 ,or in September 2014 to be eligible to enroll in October 2014. 16 years of school education abroad.
 - ② Applicants must have finished 16 years of school education by taking correspondence courses provided by the school outside of Japan, while residing in Japan, or expected to finish such process by March 2014, to be eligible to enroll in April 2014, or by September 2014 to be eligible to enroll in October 2014.
 - ③ Applicants must be recognized as having attainment of equal or a greater academic ability than other graduates of our university in the qualification examination provided by Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University and reach 22 years old by March 2014, to be enrolled in April 2014, or reach 22 years old by September 2014, to be enrolled in October 2014.
 - ④ Applicants must have completed a 15-year education outside of Japan, or must have finished 15 years of education through correspondence education provided by the school outside of Japan while residing in Japan, and must be recognized to have achieved excellent academic standing by the Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University.

2) Health:

Applicants must be in a good physical and mental health.

3) Language:

Applicants must have earned the minimum required score in any one of the following:

- ① TOEFL-iBT_(Score should be 50 or higher)
- ② TOEFL-PBT (463 or higher)
- ③ TOEIC(480 or higher)
- ④ IELTS (4.5 or higher)

4) Visa:

Applicants must have a student visa when coming to Japan

Period of Study

- Basic Course: from April 2014 to March 2016 (two years)

Specialized Course: from April 2016 to March 2019 (three years)
Or Basic Course: from October 2014 to September 2016 (two years)
Specialized Course: from October 2016 to September 2019 (three years)

Scholarship Benefits

Successful applicants are eligible to receive a stipend while in school (140,000 JPY per month for the 2013 academic year).

Note that the amount of scholarship is subject to change each academic year.

Also note that the qualifications for this privilege may be reassessed during mid-term evaluations.

Screening Procedure

- 1) Applicants must choose one of the research leaders in the Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University as his/her prospective supervisor, and must obtain permission to apply for this program from the supervisor beforehand.
- 2) Applicants must obtain all application information and forms through Internet by themselves. After filling in all the forms, they must send them to their prospective supervisor of the Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences.
- 3) Their prospective supervisors must submit all application forms to the committee for this program before the deadline for application.
- 4) The committee will have examinations for those who apply to the program. The main parts of the examination are the English test (TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS), essay and interviews.
- 5) Interviews by three committee members will be held over Internet. For details of the internet-based interview, please refer to “**Instruction for internet-based interview of Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University**” The essay exam will also be held over Internet. As an alternative, if the foreign applicants are visiting Japan on the day of the entrance examination (February 4, 2014) for Japanese applicants, they will be able to take the essay exam and have interviews with three committee members in Kumamoto University.
- 6) The total of scores of the English test, essay and interviews with three committee members will be used to score the examination.

Date of Enrollment

April 1, 2014 or October 1, 2014 (Students who wish to enroll on April 1 should have completed their admission procedures by March 27, after the announcement of examination results on March 3.)

Degrees

Doctor of Philosophy degree (Ph.D.) is conferred to students who successfully fulfill all the requirements of the basic and the specialist courses of the HIGO program.

Application Deadline

The research leaders, or prospective supervisors, of the international students should collect and submit all documents required for application to the Student Affairs Section, School of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

The deadline is Thursday, December 26, 2013.

Required Documents

[Applicants must submit the following documents.]

- 1) Application form for HIGO Program (Form 1)
- 2) Photo Identity Slip, Admission Card, Address Label (Form 2)
- 3) One photograph (Paste a 4×3cm photograph taken no more than three months prior to application, upper frontal view without a hat, with upper body showing)
- 4) A certificate of graduation (completion) or prospective graduation (completion) from the university attended
- 5) Academic record issued by the university attended
- 6) Written Statement of Reasons for Application (Form 3)
- 7) Examination fee (30,000 JPY)
- 8) A copy of the applicant's score of English examination that you took within 2 years from the day of the entrance examination (Either of the following: TOEFLibt (Score should be 50 or higher), TOEFLpbt (463 or higher), IELTS (4.5 or higher) or TOEIC (480 or higher))
- 9) A letter from the applicant's employer indicating agreement with this application, if the applicant is an employee.

Additional Statements:

- 1) Applicants are urged to discuss a research plan with their prospective supervisors of the Graduate School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Kumamoto University beforehand.
- 2) All documents should be typewritten on A4 size paper.
- 3) Applications with incomplete information, or those submitted after the deadline, will not be accepted.
- 4) No application materials will be returned to the applicants.

Attentions

- 1) Students will not be allowed to continue studying at Kumamoto University if any of the following occur:
 1. There are false statements in the application.
 2. Student is expelled or dismissed from the university as a disciplinary measure, or determined to be unlikely to complete academic requirements.
 3. Student leaves the university or transfers to another university.
 4. The status of the student visa is changed to another type of visa.
- 2) Applicants are advised to become familiar with Japanese culture, customs, climate, and the university system before coming to Japan. Japanese language skills for daily life would also be advantageous.
