Application Guidelines for Associate Course Students in HIGO Program FY2014

[What are associate course students?]

- "Associate Course Student" system has been established to enable as many students as possible to be enlightened with ties between themselves and the society and to set off spontaneously into the glocal (global + local) society, by offering them the opportunity to encounter the fascinating HIGO Program original curriculum.
- "Associate Course Student" system is defined as "trial" session specifically situated to help the students who are considering to enroll in HIGO Program get in touch with the essence of HIGO Program curriculum.
- The "Associate Course Students" are required to take more than 2 credits from the HIGO Principles of Social and Cultural Sciences, Governmental Seminar Series, Business Seminar Series, Internship, and Career Vision Development Course (HIGO Public Policy I~III, HIGO Technology and Organizational Management I~III, HIGO Cross-cultural Communication I~III) within the designated period.
- In order to be an associate student, the candidate should submit the designated application documents and be through the assessment.
- · "Associate Course Students" are eligible to receive the support by HIGO Program, mentioned below.
- The credits obtained as an associate course student will not be included in the required credits for Graduate School completion, but can be approved as HIGO Program credits when an associate student is admitted into HIGO Program, as a regular course student.

[Requirements for Associate Course Student Application]

Students must have been enrolled either in Medical Sciences or Pharmaceutical Sciences and intend to take more than 2 credits within one year from "Principles of Social and Cultural Sciences," "Governmental Seminar Series," "Business Seminar Series," "Internship" and "Career Vision Development Course" held in the HIGO Program.

As for the number of credits, refer to appendix 1; "List of subjects to be studied"

[Contents of Support]

Associate course students are eligible to receive the support mentioned below, except for the scholarship and research fund. However, availability will be discussed for each applicant due to budget limitations and other reasons.

Those who receiving other scholarships or grants might not be able to receive the support from HIGO Program. In such case, please consult the persons in charge.

- (1) Travel expense for internship
- (2) Expenses for research presentation (participation fee for domestic (within

<u>Japan only</u>) academic conference, travel expense for <u>domestic</u> academic conference, English proofreading cost, paper submission fee and so on.)
